SAFETY POLICY FOR GROUPS WALKING OFF-ROAD

- In order to improve the safety of groups walking off-road and over rough terrain, a basic Red Cross approved first aid course will be suggested/offered to the leaders of those groups involved.
 - In the event of an accident, the group leader will then be much better prepared to assess the extent of the injury and decide how to proceed.
- 2. Groups engaged in these walks should consider the purchase of a suitable first aid kit.
- 3. Group members should carry U3A ICE cards for use in an emergency.
- 4. Where we employ the use of a professional guide, this person should be confirmed as trained, equipped with a suitable first aid kit and insured.
- 5. Group members must be adequately warned in advance of the walk of applicable hazards. This would come from the guide/group leader in the "calling email" and would cover hazards such as:
 - a. Slippery/uneven surfaces.
 - b. Steep climbs/descents.
 - c. Water obstacles, etc.
- 6. The Public Liability Insurance cover provided by the U3A is not a personal insurance and covers U3A members only.
 Group members are reminded that they are responsible for their own safety and walk at their own risk.
- 7. In the event of an accident the group leader should complete an Accident Report sheet.
- 8. Copy of this policy to be given to all current and future group members and records maintained.
